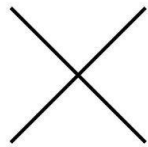

**PIN–UP HOME announces new collection
by Bernard Dubois in collaboration with BITOSSI**

New York-based design platform PIN–UP HOME announces the launch of the KASU Collection, a set of four vases designed by Belgian architect and designer Bernard Dubois and produced in partnership with Bitossi.

Dubois's design for the KASU Collection brings together the cool rigor of industrial typologies and the timeless presence of ancient vessels. Drawing on the silhouettes of Belgian châteaux d'eau, or water towers, the four vases transform an industrial archetype into objects of material richness. Handmade by Bitossi's artisans, each piece pairs graphic clarity with nuanced glazing and tactile depth, resulting in forms that feel both excavated and distilled — like artifacts from an unknown civilization, made newly precise.

The collection brings Dubois's architectural language into ceramic form, combining exacting geometry with richly worked surfaces. Produced by Bitossi, the collection embeds Dubois's design language in the heritage of one of Italy's most historic ceramic manufacturers.

Shot by French artist Marie Quéau, the campaign situates the vases among weathered industrial structures and raw natural textures, giving them a sense of age without nostalgia.

The KASU Vase Collection builds on an ongoing collaboration between Bernard Dubois and PIN–UP HOME co-founder Felix Burrichter. Following a series of vases presented for PIN–UP in 2016 and a later collection of modular cork furniture in 2019, KASU marks their first project under the PIN–UP HOME banner.

With the KASU Collection, PIN–UP HOME continues to expand its body of collaborations in contemporary design objects and home accessories. Based in New York, PIN–UP HOME brings a distinct point of view to the domestic sphere through collaborations with leading brands and designers, including Shayne Oliver, Vincent de Rijk, and PIN–UP HOME co-founder Ben Ganz.

Bernard Dubois is a Belgian architect and designer based in Brussels. After studying photography, he graduated as an architect from La Cambre in 2009 and founded Bernard Dubois Architects, a practice spanning architecture, interiors, and furniture. His work is defined by sharp formal clarity, material precision, and a sensual modernism. In 2014, he was among the curators of the Belgian Pavilion at the Venice Architecture Biennale. Alongside residential and collectible-design projects, he has developed retail spaces for brands including Courrèges, Lanvin, and Mugler, as well as gallery interiors for Xavier Hufkens. More recently, he led the interiors for The Standard, Brussels and the Beach Hotel in Cap d'Antibes. The *KASU* vase project is his fifth design collection, and the third in collaboration with PIN–UP.

Founded in 1921 in Montelupo Fiorentino, near Florence, Bitossi is one of Italy's great historic ceramic manufacturers. For more than a century, the company has combined Tuscan craftsmanship with a singular culture of design, producing handmade ceramics distinguished by material richness, formal invention, and technical precision. Its long history includes collaborations with figures ranging from Aldo Londi and Ettore Sottsass to Martino Gamper, Max Lamb, Patricia Urquiola, Nathalie Du Pasquier, Formafantasma, and Faye Toogood. The Kasu vase collection is Bitossi's first collaboration with PIN–UP HOME and Bernard Dubois.
